and flan.





President's and Director's Message: The Move of the Century!

Early last spring, knowing that good nonprofits periodically evaluate the ways in which their resources are used to further their missions, the Board of Directors of the New Bern Historical Society made considered but bold decisions which, we believe, will strengthen our programs, increase our efficiency and bring us closer to our purposes. Over a period of months we had affirmed our educative mission, audited our uses of time and funds, and assessed our stewardship of collections and property. There were clearly things that we could do better, and we moved in that direction.

One major decision with regard to our downtown campus was the move of our offices to the Attmore-Oliver House, Careful planning suggested that we could use this landmark property to continue telling a story, increase visits to the collection and create a more useful and efficient office and history center. The renewed Broad Street with convenient parking in front of the house meant that the entrance could be returned to that side as it had been for most of the life of the house, retaining gracious access through the splendid garden for those people who choose to approach from Pollock Street. Freeing the Roberts House could allow us to maintain that property if an appropriate, compatible lessee were found.

Today, we are well on the way to accomplishing those objectives. Under the guidance and with the tremendous work of curator Nancy Richards, our collection has retained the most important pieces for our story and is conserving and displaying them appropriately. Offices and research resources have been moved to the house and are more attractive and accessible. The Roberts House has been leased to the Aerie Bed and Breakfast, just across Pollock Street, and they are making important improvements that will serve their purposes and enhance our property. Initial reactions to these changes have been very positive. Even Miss Mary Oliver seems pleased with the renewed life and activity in her home.

The success of this move has required bold decisions by a board that wishes to be the most conscientious stewards. It has also required remarkable dedication on the parts of staff and, most especially, volunteers. These people have spent hundreds of hours cleaning. repairing, painting, moving, assessing and engaged in virtually every other activity that verbs can describe. There is simply no adequate way to express our gratitude.

There have been important gifts in kind, most especially, the installation of an extensive French drain in the driveway and parking area by Trader Construction. These good people seem to have solved our long standing (no pun intended) water and erosion problems. While we are actively planning the accomplishment and funding of additional needed improvements to the campus and battlefield, we are grateful for all that has been done.

Good things don't just happen. Good people make them happen, and we are fortunate to have some very good people who care deeply about the history of this lovely town and the mission of the New Bern Histori-

cal Society. 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



Battlefield Guides Are The Greatest! Meet Rolf Maris!



Department, Rolf has exhibited a willingness to contribute his time and energy to any task at the Battlefield Park. His contributions cross a wide spectrum from researching battle casualties and individual unit actions, to clearing trees and brush. maintaining trails and steps, and building and emplacing two Wood Duck nesting boxes. In the photograph he is standing near one of the two nesting boxes he constructed and installed on trees in Bullen's Branch near the base of Redan #3. (Bullen's Branch meanders through the spot where Union forces pushed through the Confederate line,

and crossed through the abatis of felled trees extending across this swampy area dammed by the Confederate defenders.) Rolf successfully installed both boxes himself. Each installation brought challenges made difficult by the necessity for lugging a large, heavy duck box, and ladder and tools while wearing hipwaders. A detailed description of those challenges will have to come from Rolf himself, something to explore with him when visiting the New Bern Battlefield Park! (article by Steve Shaffer)
