Civil War Battlefield Park

March 14, 1862. 11,000 Union troops led by General Ambrose Burnside and 13 gunboats led by Commodore Stephen Rowan, battled 4500 inexperienced, ill-equipped Confederate troops commanded by General Lawrence O'Bryan Branch to control the strategic town of New Bern, NC.

- The battlefield has been unmarked by development or agriculture, and redans remain as they were 150 years ago.
- No other Civil War battle site is so untouched since its battle day.
- Walk in the footsteps of the young soldiers who fought that fateful day.
- The battlefield is south of the city along US 70 East, at the entrance to the Taberna sub-division.
- Open 7:30am to 5:00pm, 7 days a week.
- Take your picnic lunch to the Visitor Center covered pavilion.
- The self-guided tour is free.
- Private guided tours can be arranged by calling the Historical Society Office in advance.

Civil War Adventure Day

- Annual ticketed children's event held in March.
- Registration available for 70 children, ages 6-12, and an adult family member.
- Commissary lunch provided.
- 'Young recruits' are assigned to a company, issued gear, and participate in drills, camp activities and a battle reenactment.
- Civil War re-enactors interact with recruits in a living history encampment.



Adult Education Programs

- Ed Bearrs Civil War Lecture, in January, a ticketed program.
- Dr. Richard K. Lore Annual Lecture held each Fall, free to the public.
- Lunch and Learn, a ticketed program held 5 times a year. Join members and friends at The Chelsea Restaurant for lunch and an educational, entertaining presentation.
- Evenings at the Library, free to the public. Schedule varies.
- Lectures at the Attmore-Oliver House, held during the day and evenings throughout the year. Free and ticketed lectures.

Children's Programs

- The Native American Program introduces students to the Tuscarora people, the earliest residents of New Bern.
 - The Early History of New Bern Program takes students back to 1711 to learn about the daily life of colonists.
