As always candlelit Cedar Grove Cemetery will provide plenty of eerie entertainment! If you dare pass

under the weeping gates you will meet the cemetery's famous grave diggers who will try to convince you to stay... forever. If you get past them, be on the lookout for the many ghostly characters whose lives shaped our city as they appear and disappear before your eyes.

of the 60's and The Time Machine will make an appearance at the Masonic Theatre! There will also be a Confederate encampment with a narrated drama presented by re-enactors from the 7<sup>th</sup> NC State Troops! 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## Vienna Boys Choir Performing in New Bern, March, 2013

The Vienna Boys Choir is probably the most famous boys' choir in the world, and the New Bern Historical Society is delighted to bring them to the New Bern Riverfront Convention Center to perform on Sunday, March 3 as a fundraiser.

The Vienna Boys Choir emerged from the Boys Choir attached to the Habsburg royal court founded in 1498. The original choir of six boys sang to musical accompaniment during Court Mass. Musicians such as Gluck, Mozart, Salieri, Schubert, and Bruckner played with the choir. Until 1918 they sang only at court or at the court's instruction, in church services, private concerts and state occasions.

Unlike the Court Opera, the Austrian government did not

sponsor the Boys Choir after the collapse of the Habsburg Monarchy. It was only due to an initiative of the rector of the royal Hofburg Chapel, and his friends that it was possible to continue the tradition. In 1924 the choir evolved into a professional music group, and the "Boys Choir of the Former Hofburg Chapel" started to perform outside of the Court Chapel. In 1926 they began performing abroad, and in 1932 gave their first performance in the United States.

The young choristers begin training at age six and performing at age ten. To receive the best possible musical training they attend a boarding school in the Augarten Palace in Vienna, and when on tour are accompanied by two tutors. Today there are approximately 100



boys who are divided into four choirs of equal standing named after the Austrian composers Bruckner, Haydn, Mozart and Schubert. Besides the traditional services at the Hofburg Chapel in Vienna, where the Choir sings at the Sunday mass accompanied by members of the

opera orchestra, the Vienna Boys Choir gives concerts all over the world wearing sailor suits, their official uniform since 1924.


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## Fascinating and Fun-Historical Society Education Programs

about William Gaston, one of New Bern's greatest, most accomplished citizens.




Our Native American program will be a part of the Craven Arts Festi-


val **September 29–30** at the Convention Center. Visit our booth to discover more about the lives and customs of the Tuscarora tribe.

that site to the level which will enable us to best preserve and tell its history.
