#### Our 2013 Legends in Concert: Vienna Boys Choir

The world famous Vienna Boys Choir will perform at 3:00 p.m. on March 3, 2013, at the New Bern Riverfront Convention Center as the fourth in the 'Legends in Concert' series from the New Bern Historical Society. The Historical Society is honored to present this once in a lifetime opportunity for many New Bernians.

The Vienna Boys Choir has a long, distinguished history that began in 1498 when Emperor Maximilian I moved his court and court musicians to Vienna. At that time he gave instructions to include six singing boys among the musicians. This became the foundation for the Vienna Hofmusikkapelle, or imperial musicians, and in consequence the Vienna Boys Choir. Today, the Vienna Boys Choir, Vienna Philharmonic Orchestra, and Vienna State Opera Chorus maintain the



tradition of the Hofmusikkapelle by providing music for Sunday Mass in Vienna's Imperial Chapel.

Currently there are approximately 100 choristers in the Boys Choir between the ages of ten and fourteen. They are divided into four touring choirs. The four choirs present 300 concerts and performances each year in front of almost half a million people performing for both royalty and commoners alike. Each group spends nine to eleven weeks of their school year on tour. They visit virtually every European country, and are frequent guests in Asia,

Australia and the Americas.

You will not want to miss this concert and neither will your friends! Tickets are available now. The first 100 people to purchase tickets were fortunate to receive a unique handcrafted gift envelope fashioned of antique German sheet music as a special promotion, but the gift promotion is no longer available as tickets are selling fast. General admission tickets are \$35 through February 15, 2013, then \$40; preferred seating is \$55 through February 15, 2013, then \$60; sponsor seating is \$125; active duty military and their spouses with ID are \$30: and, students with ID and children are \$25. 


