

Battlefield Park News ...by Jon Miller, Battlefield Adju-



The New Bern Battlefield Park has been a busy place the last couple of months. Visitor numbers continue to rise and early in December we gave a tour to over 120 Marines during the same visit, using four volunteer Battlefield guides. In order to help us gather raw data on visits to the Battlefield Park, the New Bern Police Department has installed a vehicle counter.



We have completed the first of two bridges over wetlands leading to Redans 5 and 6. This is due primarily to the steadfast work done by volunteer Battlefield guide Pete Meyer and an outstanding team of Boy Scouts. Pete and other volunteer Battlefield guides have worked countless hours in the cold and muck, to ensure the bridges meet permit requirements. The support structure for the second bridge has been put in place and we hope to have that second bridge completed by the end of January.

The Battlefield guides welcomed a new volunteer, Hugh Montgomery. Hugh has already gotten his boots muddy in building bridges and helping with tours. We appreciate his help! We can always use more volunteers. If you'd like to help at the Battlefield, please contact me at 252-626-1362.

Civil War Adventure Day for Children



The popular Civil War Adventure Day for children is Saturday, March 14, 2015 at the New Bern Battlefield Park. It is held annually in March to commemorate the Battle of New Bern which occurred March 14, 1862. The event is for children 6 -12 years old. Registration begins at 9:00 a.m. with activities from 9:30 a.m. – 1:00 p.m.

Young recruits and their parents will be greeted by re-enactors. An encampment with expanded living history presentations will also be set up at the battlefield. Historical Society battlefield guides will provide an informative and entertaining walking tour of the battlefield. A commissary lunch is included. After lunch, the day's activities will conclude with a battle re-enactment that includes the children. In order to make this activity accessible to as many families as possible, our Board set the reservation fee to \$20 for one child and one adult. Each ad-

members alike. This year the donations have been pouring in so we expect a larger than usual sale.


