## Livingston Taylor in Concert January 31! Tickets on Sale Now!

The New Bern Historical Society is kicking off New Bern's 300<sup>th</sup> anniversary by presenting LIVINGSTON TAYLOR IN CONCERT at the New Bern Riverfront Convention Center, Sunday, January 31, 2010, 7:30 p.m.

Livingston Taylor, brother of James Taylor and great-great-grandson of New Bern's own Isaac Taylor, is an extremely diverse musician. As a singer-songwriter he is sure to "WOW" New Bern with his top forty hits "I Will Be in Love with You" and "I'll Come Running". He also wrote Top Forty hits for James Taylor including "Boatman", "I Can Dream of You" and "Going Round One More Time". His relaxed on-stage presence belies the depth of his musical knowledge which allows him to be equally at

home performing pop, folk, bluegrass, gospel or jazz.



Livingston peppers his shows with personal stories and anecdotes and connects to audiences with his infectious warmth. He is described as a must-see in concert, a man who knows how to entertain and one of the most consistently tasteful and intelligent of songsmiths. His musical career has spanned forty years during which he toured with legends such as Jimmy Buffet, Fleetwood Mac, Linda Ronstadt and Jethro Tull. Well-liked and respected, he

continues to inspire other great musicians to record and perform with him and visit his students at Berklee College of Music in Boston where he is a full professor. He recently released his latest CD, *Last Alaska Moon*.

## Civil War Historian Ed Bearss Returns for the 4th Year

Renowned historian and battlefield guide, Ed Bearss is returning January 17, 2010 to present another fascinating program, *Lee and Grant: A Comparative Analysis*. The lecture, held at the Masonic Theater, 515 Hancock Street begins at 2:00 pm. There will be a reception immediately following in the Masonic Dining Room.

Ed Bearss was often quoted in the PBS documentary, *The Civil War*, and has received numerous honors and awards for his dedication to educating and

informing Americans about their military heritage. Since his retirement, Ed continues to write books, magazine and newspaper articles, give television and newspaper interviews and guide countless tours of our nation's battlefields. He routinely outpaces young tourists in charging over rough terrain, recreating the color of famous infantry and cavalry attacks. Ed is a strong advocate for the preservation of these battlefield sites, including the New Bern Civil War Battlefield Park.

In his eighties, he tours the country lecturing on Civil War history. Ed has a special place in his heart for New Bern and we are honored to have him visit again.
