### Attmore-Oliver House & Gardens

The Historical Society offices are located in the Attmore-Oliver House, circa 1834 in New Bern's



Historic District. In addition, there is a Civil War display, historical photos, and rooms reflecting life in the mid-19th century. Beautiful heritage gardens are located behind the house. The house is open to the public Monday-Friday from 10am to 4pm. Gardens

are open during daylight hours throughout the year.

#### New Bern Battlefield Park

On March 14, 1862, Union troops led by General Ambrose Burnside battled Confederate troops to

control the strategic town of New Bern. The battle raged for nearly six hours with the Union forces eventually forcing the retreat of the Confederate troops and the occupation of New Bern for the remainder of the Civil War.



- Owned by the Historical Society, the battlefield site has been unmarked by development.
   Fighting positions or *redans* remain as they were 150 years ago.
- Walking paths are well-defined. Large battle map and interpretive panels tell the story of the Battle of New Bern and its impact.
- Free self-guided tours. Private guided tours can be arranged by calling the Historical Society office in advance.
- The family and dog friendly park is open during daylight hours throughout the year.
- Take your picnic lunch to the Richard K. and Linda C. Lore Visitor Center covered pavilion.

Located less than 5 miles outside of the city off US 70 East at 300 Battlefield Trail.



- One of New Bern's most popular annual traditions, Ghostwalk is a self-guided, family event held after dark in late October
- Encounter historical spirits from New Bern's past in 13 Downtown Historic District sites
- Explore Cedar Grove Cemetery by candlelight and meet its historic ghosts
