One of the things I most enjoy in this position is identifying topics and speakers for our educational programs. Our last two events were very well received. The February Lunch & Learn entitled "I Too, Served America" which drew over 130 participants, focused on a project initiated by **American Legion Post #539** at Greenwood Cemetery, an all-Black cemetery owned by the City of New Bern.



The program began with Mark Sandvigen who spoke about cleaning the headstones of all veterans buried at Greenwood. Eventually 65 veterans were identified, their headstones were cleaned, and I, as Historian, am researching and writing biographies about the men buried there. Trust me when I say the research involved is no easy feat! Carol Becton, NBHS Board member and longtime community advocate volunteered to assist. She closed with a stirring reading of Langston Hughes' poem, "I Too, Sing America." We were then invited by **Rev.** Dr. Gregory Holmes, Pastor of First Missionary Baptist Church to speak at his Church. We had another enthusiastic crowd, many of whom proceeded across the street to Greenwood Cemetery to visit the graves. We would like to give special recognition to Mary Peterkin, a long-time advocate for improvement and recognition of Greenwood Cemetery.
