Three Stooges in New Bern - Who Knew? by Claudia Houston, Historian

I am continually amazed at the questions I am asked about New Bern history. A recent request involving pictures from the 1950's proved quite challenging. We

were contacted by a Mr. Kaufman from California, who had obtained photos of Helen Howard, wife of Moe Howard, the leader of the Three Stooges comedy team. In one photo, Mrs. Howard is standing in front of the Queen Anne Hotel on Broad Street (torn down and replaced by First Citizens Bank) and in another standing in front of an antique store in New Bern. Mr. Kaufmann was sure the reason Helen Howard was in New Bern was because the Three Stooges were performing with the 'Morton Downey Coca Cola Camp Show of 1951' and were on tour, traveling by bus to military camps from New England to Florida and westward to Texas. Mr. Kaufman wanted

to know precisely when and where the tour performed in New Bern.

It turns out that Morton Downey was an extremely popular singer in the 1920's and 30's, known as the "Irish Nightingale." His radio show in the 30's was sponsored by Coca Cola. This Camp Tour involved other performers such as Svelte Yvette, a song stylist, the novelty dance team of Helene and Howard, the Carmen Mastren Orchestra and, yes, the Three Stooges.

The Stoogeum Museum in Ambler, Pennsylvania proved helpful. Their curator knew about the Camp Tour,

but unfortunately did not know the date or place that the tour might have performed in New Bern.

Enter our good friend, Edward Ellis, Havelock historian, author, and former publisher of the Windsock (base newspaper at Marine Air Base Cherry Point). He discovered that the only issues of the Windsock that were online were those from 1944-1949. He then tracked down the Historian on base who sent him seven issues from 1951. The answer to the puzzle was in the last issue, dated July 14, 1951. Mr. Ellis sent me an e-mail with a "Eureka" message and a copy of a photo from the paper confirming that the Three Stooges had appeared on base with the



Morton Downey Show on July 4, 1951. The Museum completed the final piece of the tour puzzle. They were able to access the now defunct Camp Leieune base newspaper, the Globe on-line and determined that the Morton Downey Tour performed there on July 3, 1951. The tour came to New Bern on July 4 and then traveled south and performed at Fort Jackson, South Carolina on July 6. Mystery solved! Almost.

Jim Hodges, our Curator, was able to identify the house in the antique store photo as being the Jones-Jarvis-Hand house at 528 Front Street. This image was taken before Dr. Bill Hand and his family moved in the house circa the mid-1950s (the house has recently been sold). We posted this story on our Facebook page and as of this writing we have had 3,854 people who have viewed that post.

Many thanks to Edward Ellis, the Stoogeum Museum and Lawrence Kaufman for all they shared. Who says history is boring?

As the Great War came to an end in the fall of 1918, a lethal disease spread across the globe. By the time of its conclusion in March 1919, more people died from what was known as the Spanish Flu than died in the war itself, including an estimated 13,000 North Carolinians. Eastern Carolina Archivist will explore this deadly influenza virus strain and its rampage throughout eastern North Carolina, as well as its impact on society, medical care, and public health.




Book Signing

Various Downtown Locations


It was the most devastating fire in our NC history, destroying hundreds of buildings and leaving more than 3,000 people homeless, largely in the African American community. And it was 100 years ago on December 1st.

Join us as a community in learning about and remembering this tragic event and the effect it had on the people of New Bern. The Great Fire

Commemoration will consist of four days of events, to include free presentations, free tours of the Great Fire of '22 exhibit at the Firemen's Museum, a commemorative outdoor vigil, and free trolley tours following the path of the fire.

This Commemorative Weekend is the product of a partnership of organizations who came together to underscore the importance of remembering this historic event, including: The African American Heritage & Cultural Center, City of New Bern, Craven County Tourism and Development Authority, Earl of Craven Questers, New Bern Fireman's Museum, New Bern Historical Society, New Bern Tours, St. Cyprian's Episcopal Church, St. Peter's AME Zion Church, Swiss Bear, Tryon Palace, and Uptown Business and Professional Association, Inc.


