## Update from Anthony Giardino, Executive Director

#### 34 Years of Ghostwalk - that's some impressive history!

It's remarkable when you think about it. The New Bern Historical Society's most successful storytelling fundraising event continues to grow in popularity and demand every year. We interact with people from all over Eastern North Carolina who not only have heard of this unique event, but eagerly contact us months

in advance just to book their Ghostwalk weekends! Some families even make it an annual tradition! Last year we hosted over 2000 attendees. You might wonder, for a small nonprofit organization, how is that even possible?

The answer is simple. Ghostwalk thrives because of our talented and devoted *PEOPLE*! We are fortunate to attract

the most loyal and enthusiastic volunteers committed to sharing New Bern's most exciting historical tales. From our committee members, to the scriptwriters, directors, enthralling performers, generous homeowners, and the hard-working logistics and operations support teams - it takes more than 200 *PEOPLE* to masterfully "bring history to life!" It turns out we're not such a small nonprofit organization after all!

What started as "New Bern at Night" back in 1986—a one night affair touring 5 historic locations—officially rebranded as "Ghost Walk" in 1991 with 6 historic stops on a November evening. Now, *Ghostwalk* delivers 3 nights of spirited storytelling from 14 locations as well as a dance performance, bakery offerings, and even tours and food offerings at 6 historic churches!

# Remember, Honor, Teach... by Claudia Houston, Historian

This year, the *Wreaths Across America* program will be sponsored at Cedar Grove Cemetery for the first time. The goal is to place wreaths on the graves of every veteran

across America during the December holidays. This program is also sponsored at New Bern National and Greenwood Cemeteries. The New Bern Historical Society will assist with identifying all veterans buried at Cedar Grove and accurately chart the location for each of the 369 veterans there.

At Cedar Grove, I visited the vault of Elijah Ellis, a prominent New Bern merchant, and recalled the story of a Union soldier who was also buried at this spot. Unfortunately, most would not know it because there is no headstone indicating this. That solider was William Ennever, born in England and moved with his family to Philadelphia then on to New York City, where he was a druggist. At age nineteen, he joined the 158th NY Regiment and was stationed with his unit at Bachelor's Creek. On May 26, 1864, when the daily train from New Bern arrived, William and many other soldiers were waiting near the railroad tracks for letters or packages. Also aboard were several barrels filled with torpedoes, each containing 250 lbs of gunpowder. No one had been informed of this, and the barrels were rolled off the train without caution. One barrel hit another, causing an explosion that instantly killed 35 men and injured countless others, including William. He was brought to Foster Hospital in New Bern and died two days later. With the permission of Elijah Ellis, William was interred in

his vault. As of yet, no one knows why.

At one point, a GAR (Grand Army of the Republic) marker was placed by the vault, but it was stolen. Many years later, it was found at a flea market in South Carolina. The purchaser contacted an organization in New Bern, and it was returned and presented to William's relative jointly by the Sons of the Confederate Veterans and the Sons of Union Veterans during a ceremony conducted at Cedar Grove on June 18, 2016. After verifying his burial at Cedar Grove, obtaining the approval of his relative and approval from the owner of the burial plot, an application is in the works for a headstone for William Ennever. Hopefully, this request will be granted so that a wreath can be placed on his headstone among the other veterans this holiday season.



How can you help with this project? Do you know of a veteran buried at Cedar Grove? Would you like to assist in identifying gravesites and researching




# "Stories of the United States Colored Troops" By Jerilyn Lee

# Battlefield Park News...by Gene Lock, Battlefield Adjutant

New Bern Battlefield Park encompasses the point where the Union forces breakthrough of the Confederate defensive line took place. It is located the furthest distance in the park

from the Visitors Center. A few years ago, we opened our Loop Trail that runs through Redan One, then along the railroad out to the break-through point, and then continues along the Bullen Branch swamp back to the Trader Bridge. It is a beautiful trail that features various birds, beavers and a beaver hut. It is a long walk that includes several hills which can be tiring. Thanks to a generous donation from the **New Bern Civil War Roundtable**, we initiated the plan to place seven park benches along the Loop Trail for resting or just enjoying nature.

As fate would have it, we were contacted by The **Epiphany School** offering a group of students to do a community-oriented project. Our Battlefield Guides precut the wood components for the benches and then 13 students assembled them and assisted in placing them out on the trail. They did a beautiful job and each student signed the benches they worked on. We would like to thank **The Epiphany School** for their help with this project! The boys and girls competed to see who would finish the first bench; however, the results of this friendly competition will remain a secret with us! Our volunteers truly enjoyed working with these great young people.



On October 5th, we hosted the <u>Living History</u> <u>Day</u> event at the Battlefield. We want to thank the dedicated Civil War reenactors who taught us about life at the time of the Civil War and related it to conditions experienced right here at the Battle of New Bern.

During recent storms, a large tree fell and got hung up in other trees overhanging a major trail. Our volunteers are always willing to take on some forest work, but occasionally we encounter a situation beyond our talents to handle safely. When this takes place and we need expert help, we call on **Pamlico Tree Care**. For many years they have been quick to assist with the big jobs and even donate wood chips to lay on our trails. Once again, they came to the rescue and had this hazardous tree down safely—all free of charge as a service to our park preservation efforts! The Battlefield volunteers and the Historical Society would like to recognize and thank Pamlico Tree Care for their continued support of the Battlefield - we greatly appreciate you!
